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## 2021-2022 HIGHLIGHTS & GRANTS -

#### GRANTS

While our grant applications and requests vary from year-to-year, DEF is excited to reward innovation in our schools.

PROJECT NAME	SUMMARY	\$ GRANT AMOUNT
STEM Tubs for 1st Grade Classrooms	The grant provides 1st grade students (approximately 190 student per year) with a variety of STEM enrichment activities. Each 1st grade classroom received a set of 10 tubs to be used by 2-3 students.	\$2,753
Marine Science Field Trip	Two third grade classrooms attended a field trip to DBMS to learn about the lifecycle of an oyster and local aquaculture in DBMS marine science labs as a pilot for new science unit.	\$150
Lego Spike Prime Robotic Sets	The grant funded the purchase of 78 Lego Spike Prime Robotics sets to replace the current Lego EV3s that aged out because of wear and tear.	\$26,340
Outdoor Classroom	The project funds the refresh and revitalization of the outdoor classroom in the space in the center of the Outdoor Learning Center behind Alden Elementary School. It includes wooden benches, fencing, large rocks for seating, wind chimes, sun dial and support materials for Alden teachers looking for innovative ways to teach outdoors and embrace the natural setting. The space is intended to be used by Alden, DMS, and DHS potentially impacting 600 students per year.	\$4,000
5 Stationary Bikes at Alden	This grant purchased 5 stationary bikes at Alden Elementary. Three for the Alden Gym, one for the Adjustment Counselor's Room, and one for the Partnership Room.	\$2,314.20
Math Coaching Professional Development Series at Alden	This program supports a series of highly personalized training sessions for Alden teachers, specifically focused on providing innovative strategies to address learning loss in math due to the COVID pandemic.	\$3,960
3 Series Beginning Reader Books	This grant funds appropriate decodable texts for small group instruction. They are aligned with phonics and phonemic awareness programs which intern target the foundational reading skills being taught.	\$5,450
Virtual Field Trip with Christa McAuliffe Center @ Framingham State College	All 8 <sup>th</sup> grade science classes (240 students) participated in a virtual field trip that included virtual mission simulations where students were able to work in teams to take on the roles of astronauts, scientists, and engineers. They engaged in space exploration simulations that test their teamwork, problem solving, and decision-making skills. Students took on specific jobs and work collaboratively with their peers. The virtual programs are LIVE, engage participants in synchronous activities, and encourage interaction between the participants and the expert program facilitators.	\$1,000
MIT DNA, RNA and Protein Synthesis Manipulative LEGO Kits	These MIT DNA, RNA, and protein synthesis manipulative LEGO kits are a valuable modeling tool that can now be used by all 9 <sup>th</sup> grade Biology students. These LEGO kits are extremely thorough in detail and correlate with the Biology State Standards of modeling DNA and protein synthesis which rely on making models and connections throughout the course. When students can accurately model DNA, protein synthesis, and mutations, they will be able to better understand genetics and evolution. Unlike most teaching aids, the MIT models are designed to teach what the molecules do, not just what molecules look like.	\$10,400
Alden RESPECT/SEL Book	The grant is for mentor and supplemental picture books to support our new SEL curriculum framed around our Alden RESPECT values. The books are for both classroom teachers (these books will be accompanied by already-authored lessons) and a new RESPECT resource library for teacher use that will be housed in the Alden Library.	\$3,100
Oyster Upweller Field Trip	This grant funded books and a field trip to the Duxbury Maritime School for two third grade classrooms. After the field trip, teachers plan to finalizes an oyster unit/curriculum which should be taught in 3rd grade and be accompanied by future 3rd grade field trips to DBMS.	\$210
